## Jeannine Doyle, Linthicum

Jeannine Doyle always wanted to work in design or construction. Born in Page, Arizona, she watched her father, former chief of construction for the Bureau of Reclamation, build the dam at Glen Canyon and other water projects.

As vice president and partner of Scottsdale-based Linthicum, Doyle manages some 40 employees in Arizona and Hawaii. The award-winning firm specializes in handcrafting high-end estate homes, upscale golf clubhouses and resorts, and highly designed commercial buildings.

With more than 17 years at the firm, Doyle oversees all preconstruction and estimating activities, owner contract negotiations and risk management for Linthicum.

"We look for projects that are unique in nature," Doyle says. "We pride ourselves on building long-term relationships through superior craftsmanship and exceptional service."

Building clubhouses in premier golf destinations has been one of the firm's specialties. Clients have included Silverleaf Clubhouse, both the Chiricahua and Apache Clubhouses at Desert Mountain, Mirabel Golf Community, Troon North, Legend Trail and Rio Verde.

"The other side of our business is custom residential work. We may build a custom home for a client in Arizona who wants a vacation home in Hawaii," she explains.

When Linthicum opened their office in Hawaii in 2003, projects there represented 25% of the firm's annual revenue. That number has since increased to 50%.

Linthicum is currently underway with a large resort project on the island of Kauai in Hawaii.

"A lot of our work is repeat business," she says. "We've worked with DMB, Lyle Anderson and Kabuto Properties on several different projects."

Doyle became involved with ABA in 1997 when she enrolled in the organization's Leadership Development Forum (LDF).

"It definitely enhanced my career," she says. "It is a well-respected program that helps people see the bigger picture of the construction business."

Since then she has participated in educational programs, served on committees and recently completed classes through ABA's Senior Executive Program.

In her free time, Doyle likes to travel to exotic locations, such as Tahiti, or closer to home wherever there is a Nascar race going on.

"I'm a big race fan, and I'm also a die-hard Phoenix Coyotes fan. My husband and I attend all of their weekend home games," she says. ■
